Third-Party Plugins

WordPress plugins provide additional functionality over the core WordPress distribution. Think of them like apps you install on your smartphone.

The SiteWorks team only supports the plugins installed during site setup. These are listed and described in the Operational Procedures; see https://siteworks.u3a.org.uk menu Web Manager > Operational Procedures. If a site installs a third-party plugin the Sysadmin team make an assessment. If there are concerns, such as security risks, we will contact the site admin.

The SiteWorks team don't make formal recommendations, although, like everyone else, team members will express their experiences on the forum or drop-in sessions. If you have a particular requirement for some functionality, then:

- Refer to the list of popular plugins below
- Ask on the forum https://u3awpdev.org.uk (you need to register). Don't be put off because much of the forum is pretty technical.
- Look at 'Add Plugins' on your Dashboard. Search for the topic of what you want to do. Ideally, do this on Local WP to try out plugins away from your live site.
- When browsing plugins, be wary of those with relatively few active installations or don't receive regular updates. Check out the user reviews. If a review looks out of place (one-star rating or over-the-top praise), check the profile of the reviewer and ignore if they have only ever reviewed one or two plugins. Basically, follow the same principle when planning a holiday destination and accommodation.



In descending order of the number of installations on SiteWorks production sites, these are the top 10 most popular plugins, along with a category of what they do.:

Change Board - WordPress 6.8

WordPress 6.8 is due on 15 April. A release for testing should be available on 25 March. Our Sysadmin will then coordinate testing the SiteWorks plugins and making any necessary changes.

We expect some improvements to the experience of Web Managers, Editors, and Authors and will communicate the changes before we deploy 6.8. This also means we will review and update the User Guide and Learning Guides as necessary.
